Lights

Ever since the Parish Council discovered that many of the wooden poles carrying our footway lights were rotted at their tops there has been an inexorable progress to the point where we are having to disconnect these lights and remove the poles entirely. It has been an extremely contentious issue but looking back, three factors have been overwhelming and non-negotiable. Firstly, our insurers told us that they would not be able to provide public liability cover. Secondly, no company was able to test the poles and provide a guarantee acceptable to our insurers. Thirdly, the rules for providing a connection to new lights has changed whereby only an underground supply is now acceptable. It has been a difficult time for the Council but the outcome has been inevitable.

The Council has now turned its attention to the lights on the estate areas. In the Perkins Close and St Matthews Close areas some of the lights have mercury lamps. These are being phased out under EU regulations. In the Ban Brook area some of the columns are suffering from "concrete cancer" which is a condition where water gets into the concrete and rusts the steel reinforcement causing it to expand and crack the concrete. In both these areas consultation exercises have been carried out but no clear mandate has emerged. The Parish Council has therefore decided to carry out another trial switch off starting in October and extending to March next year to see if this confirms residents views one way or another. The Council has circulated letters to all residents in these areas and the trial will be subject to any weight of opinion expressed in response to these letters.

Planters

In several newsletters over the past two years we have invited residents to "adopt a planter". The result has not been overwhelming with only a very few residents expressing any interest. Many residents say that the planters are a distinctive feature of the parish but some have said that we should not be spending the £2500 per year that they cost. What do you think? Councillors will be making decisions about the future of this contract over the next few meetings and will really welcome your views.

We will be delivering soil conditioner to the site and also helping with the initial cultivation of new plots. Two vacant plots remain; anyone interested in acquiring a plot should contact the Clerk.

Recycling

You may have noticed a label attached to your recycling bin recently. A full list of what can and what cannot be recycled is on the Stratford District Council website. Many people are confused by the types of plastics that can be recycled so here is the list. You **can** recycle bottles, yoghurt pots, margarine and ice cream tubs, fruit punnets, and microwave meal trays. You **cannot** recycle plastic film, cling film and film lids. In particular you cannot recycle plastic shopping bags or plastic rubbish bags so do not put your recycling in these bags!

Playing Field

Cllr. Quiney makes a weekly inspection of our Playing Field and he has reported that he has never seen any children using the skate park. The skate park was opened in 2005 but we all know that children's interests move on and skate boards appear to have been replaced by mini scooters. No doubt, as the Olympics approach, BMX tracks will be back on the agenda! The Council wants to know what residents, and particularly younger residents, think about equipment on the Playing Field. To this end we will be holding an "Open Morning" on **Saturday 8th. October between 10.30 am. and 12 noon** when everyone with a view can come to the Playing Field, meet with Councillors, and say just what they think.
