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Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

At the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 22nd April, PCSO Becky Morris gave a presentation on Neighbourhood Watch Schemes, which are intended to be the 'eyes and ears' of the local community in terms of monitoring and reporting suspicious people and activity. In 1991 a scheme was set up in the parish, as a result of a SPRAG initiative, and ran successfully for a number of years. Initially there was a head co-ordinator and up to 18 area co-ordinators to cover the whole of the parish.

However, in recent years, the scheme has become inactive, and Becky Morris suggested that it would be beneficial for the parish to re-establish a group, if enough people are interested in taking part. Particular concerns at the moment are the numbers of bogus callers in the area, who tend to prey on elderly and vulnerable people.

The Parish Council is keen to promote interest in a Neighbourhood Watch Group, and would be pleased to hear from anyone who would be interested to contact the Parish Clerk in the first instance.

B439 Focus Group Update

The Parish Council commissioned a covert speed check on various roads. The headline results are included here.

The speed quoted for each location is the 85th percentile. This means 85% of vehicles travelled at this speed or below across a 24 hour period.

No one likes putting their foot in it!

Bagged Dog mess can be placed in any litter bin.

Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly – ‘bag it and bin it’. Make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.

Not picking up after your dog has fouled is a Criminal Offence. You can be fined up to £1000 and you will get a CRIMINAL RECORD.

Respect. Protect. Enjoy.

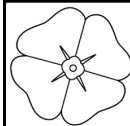
Respect other people and consider the local community and other people enjoying the outdoors. Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available .
