Salford 7 Neighbourhood Development Plan

Where are we now

During the public consultation in late summer last year, a large number of comments were received. A questionnaire was also distributed to every house in the village of Salford Priors during October that asked questions relating to development of Orchard Farm. 61% responded with 56% wanting to see the two halves of the village joined and 49% were in favour of development of the Orchard Farm site. It was agreed to keep this site in the plan. In November an exhibition was held to canvas views on a proposed housing site at Orchard Close off the Evesham Road. 64% of those who attend were not in favour of the site; it has been excluded from the plan. The plan has now been updated in line with the comments and has been submitted to Stratford District Council in preparation for their six week public consultation exercise, which includes independent examination. It is hoped that the plan will go to referendum later this year.

Proposed Gravel Extraction Site 7 Update

(Site 7 covers both sides of School Road from Tothall Lane to opposite the Queens Head Pub)

Salford Priors Parish Council objected strongly to the inclusion of "Site 7" in the Warwickshire County Council (WCC) Minerals Plan.

The initial public consultation phase has now closed and WCC are considering their response to the large number of representations made. This is anticipated to be forthcoming in 6 to 9 months. At that time, the plan will be presented at WCC cabinet for approval to move to the next stage. If "Site 7" is still in the WCC proposal when approved by cabinet, Salford Priors Parish Council will consider commissioning an ecological and environmental impact survey and make corresponding representations against the site.

After that the plan will go into a publication stage for the final draft and there will be a legal consultation phase of 6 weeks. After any required amendments are made the plan will then be sent to the Government for an examination in public to be run by an independent inspector. The inspector then reports back to WCC with any final modifications before the plan is adopted. This may not be until the end of 2017.

The Parish Council would like to assure residents that they will continue to oppose "Site 7" throughout the minerals planning period and use all due processes available to them to get the site removed.

A residents' action group has been formed called 'Salford Priors Against Gravel Extraction' (SPAGE). The council will be engaging on a regular basis with the group through the open forum section of the council meetings.

Play Equipment Upgrade

The Parish Council is planning a substantial upgrade to the play equipment on the Playing Field. At present there is an under 14's play area, a skate ramp, basketball hoop and a 5-side goal. Councillors have considered a number of options including:

*Upgrading the under 14's area with new equipment
Replacing the ageing skate ramp with a new one
Adding a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA)*

At the end of October last year, consultations were held at the TOPs building and local residents of all ages were invited to attend and to say what their priority would be. The majority of people who attended these consultations felt that a **Multi Use Games Area** would be their first choice, as it could be used by all ages, would enable a number of sports to be played, and would be of great benefit to the local community.

A Working Group has been set up to oversee this project. At the moment, we are seeking quotations from four national companies which provide this equipment with a view to having this installed later this year.

Alamo Development (Bovis Homes) Update

The site has been purchased by Bovis Homes and they have submitted their reserved matters planning application for 60 homes to Stratford District Council.

At a council meeting in January, residents and councillors were shown the detailed plan and discussed their concerns with representatives of Bovis. The council's response can be found on our website under planning applications.

If you have any issues caused from the construction activities at the site during development, please contact the Clerk. The Council will remain in regular contact with Bovis and the site manager.

Street Lights Working Group

The Council has received many requests during the last 12 months asking for street lights to be reinstated around the parish.

A questionnaire was distributed to all houses in School Ave of the 21 questionnaires returned, 19 supported the provision of street lights being installed in School Avenue.

At January's meeting it was agreed to form a Working Group of councillors to establish a five year rolling plan for the replacement of the existing street lights, to also look at the feasibility of installing new street lights to School Ave in the first instance.

Significant Planning Application Decisions

St Matthew's Church extension was opposed by the Parish Council and refused by Stratford District Council on 24th February 2016.

The Parish Council fully supported a 5 home development at Heath Cottage, Dunnington and this was granted planning permission by Stratford District Council on 1st March 2016.
