You may have spotted the newly installed twenty is plenty advisory signs within Salford Priors and Dunnington. These are only advisory signs, however it reminds drivers about the presence of pedestrians, children, cyclists and horse riders that frequent our rural roads.

## Public Open Space

We want to let the residents of Salford Priors Parish know that we are aware of the open space on the CALA homes estate. It is currently out of the Parish Council's control as the open space still belongs to CALA homes and is yet to be handed over for the Parish Council to maintain.

We remain in contact with CALA homes to get the issue of the open space sorted along with the bus shelter which is yet to be installed and the traffic calming along School Road. Please know we are doing everything in our power to get these matters resolved as soon as possible. Once handed over the open space will be maintained in accordance with the planning consent and the Parish Council's high standards of amenity management and maintenance ensuring that this asset is protected for future generations and an open space we can all be proud of.
